PK's Points

"What's in Your Wheelhouse?"

There's an old television commercial for services that will help a growing business. The "plot" of the commercial has a businessman agreeing to be able to handle all kinds of deals. Saying each time, "I can do that." But after realizing all that he has promised, he admits to the camera that he's uncertain to being able to pull it all off. "I can do that. I can do that. I can do that. (Then to the camera) How am I going to do that?" Then the ad reveals its latest product or computer technology that will help small businesses be able to do more business without being overwhelmed. The ad recognizes that businesses can do it, but without their product, it may take more time to get it done because some of the steps necessary are not in the company's wheelhouse.

It's like finishing drywall. I can do it, but it takes me 5 times longer than the experienced guy. Finishing drywall for the experienced guy is in his wheelhouse. He does it every day. He could do it in his sleep. He/she knows the techniques and even has his/her preferred brand of mud.

Maybe it's like doing payroll or taxes. You can do it, but it takes you a lot more energy, time, and brain-power because you don't do it very often. It's not your wheelhouse. But the tax-expert handles the work with little problem because it's in his/her wheelhouse.

We seem to be living in a day and age of specialization. The education system has teachers who "specialize" in teaching specific subjects. Medical professionals "specialize" in almost everything. This trend follows a philosophy of narrowing your focus and working within your sweet spot in order to offer best practices (regarding expertise, thoroughness, and efficiency). It's a way to capitalize on resources and not overtax any one specific individual and allow people to work within their wheelhouse.

Here at Hillside, I have often mentioned that there are a lot of us around here that wear many hats. And I am so thankful that so many of us are willing to serve and even sacrifice in order to offer the ministries that we do. Remember, we are called to serve. And we are called to make sacrifices. And there are times in which we are asked to serve outside our areas of comfort, and that is a good thing. We need to be ready to respond to those calls when prompted by the Lord. And yet, it's great when we, for the most part and for the majority of the time, are able to serve within our wheelhouse.
