### PK's Points:

### What's all in Worship and Are you "All In"?

Our desire for Sunday morning at Hillside is that we would gather for worship and scatter for evangelism. Part of that evangelism may include inviting friends, family, co-workers, etc. to our worship service as we want to encourage all to "come and see" and "go and tell" of Christ, and we count it a privilege to minister unto and worship alongside visitors. But as we consider our "Worship Service", what all are we talking about as we use that term "worship"? What does worship entail? Worship is the heartfelt, mental and physical response we have towards God as we ascribe worth to Him. We could thus make a 2-word definition of worship to be "ascribing worth". And God's Word gives us ample understanding as to how we can do just that.

Why do we do what we do on Sunday morning? Hopefully we understand that what we do on Sunday morning comes to us from scripture. That throughout the 66 books, we are able to understand who God is as He has revealed Himself to us through the Word, Jesus Christ, and then the written Word, the inspired Word of God, the Bible. We are also able to read, either by command or by prescriptive and descriptive practice of the early church as to how we can respond to Him in worship. That if we were to boil a worship service down to its bare bones, we would say that it needs to include some aspect of the following elements: focused on God centered around Christ, an opportunity to praise Him through music, the possibility to give unto Him in giving, speaking to Him through prayer and having a priority of hearing from Him through His Word. What's all in Worship? Worship is so much more than the "song service" portion of a Sunday morning. For we worship in giving, and we worship in singing, and we worship in praying, and we worship in sitting under the reading and teaching/preaching of His Word. It's all part of worship.

And a true response to God should place you in an "all in" mindset. That is that we don't want to hold anything back as we reflect upon God and His grace and goodness unto us as He sent Christ to be our Redeemer. And so, from the very 1st verse we read Sunday mornings, that our hearts and minds are engaged, responding to Who God is. And as our heads are bowed, our mind is active as we agree with what is being prayed about. From the 1st song played, where music softens our heart to God, that we praise Him for is awesomeness. That when we drop our offering into the plate in the foyer or click send on our phone, that we give cheerfully unto the Lord recognizing His blessing unto us. And we sit, attentively, interacting with God's Word as we listen to His still, small voice speaking to our heart as God's Word speaks to us. Are you "all in" on Sunday mornings?

"All in" looks different from person to person. Some are "all in" with a stoic face (smile once in a while), others are "all in" being all smiles most of the time. Some

are "all in" with eyes closed (not sleeping, but not being distracted). Some are "all in" by taking scrupulous notes during the message. Some are "all in" with hands lifted high as they sing (I'm a ½ way raised type of guy :). "All in" might look or sound different because worship is a personal response to God that we do together. Now, each church has it's unspoken "code of conduct" of what they collectively agree to but there is room for personal expression as we love God for Who He is and desire to ascribe Him worth.

In case you are new to Hillside – allow me to give you a quick run-down of our Sunday AM Worship Service and its bare bones:

- **Giving** Giving in voluntary but in line with 1 Cor. 16:2. We offer 2 ways to give. There are 2 offering plates in the foyer right outside the center doors to the auditorium that you may place your offering into. Our deacons keep an eye on the plates, emptying them periodically throughout the morning. Or you can give online through our website **hillsidebaptistrittman.org**.
- Music We desire to sing Psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs according to Colossian 3:16. We choose instrumentation and amplification (microphones) in order to aid us in our worshipful singing. We are adapting to following the lead of a guitar versus a piano not from a change of ministry philosophy but of necessity, and we are thankful for God's provision of our gifted instrumentalists and their leadership.
- **Praying** We pray to God the Father through Jesus Christ our Savior, giving praise to Him as we oftentimes recite scripture back to Him. We take this prayer time to intercede on behalf of others, whether church family or missionaries and offer thanksgiving for God's many blessings unto us.
- **Scripture** The upholding of Scripture continues to be the focal point of our time together in worship. For it is the centrality of the spoken Word that convicts the unbeliever of their need for salvation, challenges the carnal believer towards a closer walk with Christ, and encourages the spiritual to continue on in living out their calling to be salt and light.

When you boil it all down, what's all in a worship service may not seem like a whole lot. But we're called to be "all in" about it as we love God and respond to His revelation – the salvation and lordship of Jesus Christ. Let's be "all in" in our worship.

### How to Pack Your Shoebox:

- 1. **Find a Shoebox:** Get a standard-size shoebox to pack for a boy or girl. *Feel free to use the pre-printed boxes in the coffee room at the church.*
- 2. **Get your Label:** Determine whether you want to pack a box for a boy or girl and which age.
- 3. **Fill with Gifts:** First, select a quality "wow" toy such as a soccer ball with pump or stuffed animal then fill with other fun toys, hygiene items, and school supplies. Don't forget to also include a personal note and photo—sometimes these are the child's favorite things to receive!
- 4. **Pray:** Most importantly, pray for the child who will receive your shoebox gift.
- 5. **Donate \$10 per Shoebox:** A donation of \$10 is critical to cover shipping and other project costs. Give online through Follow Your Box and discover the destination of your shoebox or send a check in the postage-paid envelope provided on the brochure.
- 6. **Drop off**: Place your shoebox at Hillside in the coffee room by Sunday, Nov. 19th.

<u>Do NOT include:</u> candy; toothpaste; gum; used or damaged items; scary or war-related items; seeds; food; drink mixes; liquids or lotions; medications or vitamins; breakable items or glass containers; aerosol cans. \**Information received from Samaritan's Purse*.

If you would prefer to give money toward a shoebox, you can place funds in a designated envelope on the Welcome Center and place in offering plate by Nov. 12.
