Spaces and Places (and merch, oh my!)

With all of the current updates to our church, I like to be reminded why updates really do matter.

In Haggai 1, God brings a solemn charge against the people of Israel. As the remnant of people began to rebuild Jerusalem, the common thought was "now is not the time to rebuild the temple, it's not important" But God (sarcastically) asks then if *it is* the right time to live in nice houses and ignore the temple (Haggai 1:2-4). God then goes on to declare a command to rebuild the temple in Jerusalem, demonstrating that He cared about the physical structure in which His people worshipped Him.

But that was the Old Testament, where the glory of the temple was supposed to be a hint of the glory of God. Do physical spaces still matter today? We believe they do, and here are a few reasons why.

A Theology of Spaces

<u>Reason 1: God is glorified through good stewardship</u>. Stewardship, in the Christian sense, is both a recognition that everything we have is a gift from God and a response of gratefulness, generosity, and proper handling. Simply put, when God entrusts to us any physical thing, He intends for us to steward it well. The physical spaces in which you and I operate are also things that God expects us to steward. Upkeep and updates are both aspects of good stewardship.

<u>Reason 2: our building demonstrates our view of God</u>. Cathedrals were built so that as worshippers entered their attention would be drawn upward, bringing about a sense of smallness in such large spaces. The intent was to use the physical space to remind people of the grandness and greatness of God, and to keep the humility of that feeling as they then worshipped. Today, there is still a sense of purpose behind the choices of architecture and décor. We want to communicate our love for God by the way we use our building. We don't update for the sole purpose of looking "professional" but so that people recognize the orderliness of our God while also recognizing our love for Him.

A Philosophy of Third Places

<u>Reason 3: our building communicates how we feel about people</u>. In sociology, some people talk about a "third place," the unique social location that is separate from the two usual locations of home and work/school. Secularly, these are parks, diners, libraries, etc. But for the Christian, we call it our church. We want our building to be an inviting place of community. The use of our space should aid in the fellowship and growth of our church people, and updates help us accomplish that purpose.

Reason 4: our building expresses our identity. Consider another historic architectural feature that helped to distinguish a church building among the skyline: the steeple. Again, the physical place communicated to even non-churched people that the identity of the building was Christian. Our updates, similarly, express who we are to anyone visiting or attending. While we'd love to be known as the church that learns together and lives transformed, our message is lost if we are instead known as the church whose building fell apart.

Speaking of expressing our identity...Hillside is getting some Merch! The opportunity to purchase shirts, hats, bags, etc. with Hillside's logo is now available (see below)! These are great ways to signify you belong to the Hillside family.

A Word of Warning

As with anything, there are extremes to be avoided. If we neglect any updates and upkeep, our building would fall into disrepair, the ministry would suffer, and it's even possible that God's reputation would suffer as a result. However, if we were to only obsess over our building, we would lose sight of the fact that we are the church, and 19 W. Ohio is just a building. In this extreme, the ministry would also suffer, as souls are neglected for structures.

God calls the church a "pillar and buttress of the truth." May our physical spaces reflect the spiritual attitude we carry: whether we eat, or drink, (or update!), we do all to the glory of God!

Synergy Snapshot:

Wednesday Teaching Series:

March – HEART ABLAZE: Made Alive to Worship A four-lesson topical series on worship. Students will learn to see God for Who He is and learn to exalt Him. They will learn to view themselves in light of God's character and humbly kneel before Him. They will be challenged to make worship a daily practice as they spend time with God. Ultimately, they will learn to live for God's glory as an act of worship.
