## The Lost Discipline of Lament

Pastor Rick's Reflections

Recently, the sensitive and serious topic of suicide was covered in our Wednesday evening student ministry. According to government records, there are 4,004 students in the schools and co-ops represented in our youth group. If statistics are accurate, then 80 students that walk the same halls as our students will take direct actions toward suicide sometime in their life, while another 720 students will have "thoughts dominated and overwhelmed with death and suicide" due to emotional pain. Clearly, people are hurting.

But the pain isn't just "out there," it's also being felt in our church. We've had some hard losses lately. Sickness, death, and suffering hit our church family wave after wave it seems. How does someone deal with suffering? Can a Christian rightly complain about the hurts of life, and if so, how? The answer is a discipline lost in the American church: lament.

To lament is to passionately express grief and sorrow. It is to mourn, actively and openly, often accompanied by weeping. In musical analogy, it is the song of prayer but in a minor key (to borrow an idea from Mark Vroegop). The Bible has chapters upon chapters of lament psalms and prayers. Jeremiah wrote an entire book of them, aptly named "lamentations." Lament is found all over in historical Christian liturgy.

Following the pattern of Scripture, let's consider how to rightly complain to our God about the wrongs and hurts of the world. Doing so gives us the acronym "**TCAT**." Let's consider Psalm 77 together.

**TURN** (Psalm 77:1-2a "I cried out to God for help; I cried out to God to hear me. When I was in distress, I sought the Lord.")

When a toddler stumbles and falls, they instinctively turn to find comfort in a parent or loved one. When we hurt, we also make a "turn." You've heard the expression "they turned to alcohol," and that's the concept, just a bad example of it. For the Christian, we must make the deliberate choice in our pain to turn toward our God. Others may turn to substances, anxieties, and distractions, but we choose to face up, looking to God, even if to ask "Why" or "How much longer?"

It could sound like this: "God, it's me again. I'm overwhelmed. My heart is full of fear and dread. I feel stuck. I feel like I'm drowning. But I'm reaching out."

**COMPLAIN** (Psalm 77:7-9 ""Will the Lord reject forever? Will he never show his favor again? Has his unfailing love vanished forever? Has his promise failed for all time? Has God forgotten to be merciful? Has he in anger withheld his compassion?")

This one is hard for some to grapple with, since the Bible tells us to do all things without grumbling and complaining. But here we are not grumbling, we are rightly declaring things as they are: bad. When we lament cancer, or lament death, or lament injustice, we are rightly declaring "God, this is not good. This is not right. This hurts." Complaining just to whine and stew in a bad attitude is sin. To declare the truth of hurt to God in lament is prayer. It's an important distinction.

Our Complaint could sound like this: "You've heard the unfair words said about me. You know the cancer is back. I thought I was doing good, why would this happen? How can I keep going under this stress? This is awful."

**ASK** (Psalm 77:10 "Then I thought, "To this I will appeal: the years when the Most High stretched out his right hand.)

Here is where biblical lamenting turns a clear direction away from sinful complaining. We now ask God to do something about the pain. This is not a simple "God fix it" prayer, though. The mature Christian knows that God works in and through suffering. It can be impossibly hard, but God's Word shows us how and gives us the language to express it. "I will appeal" is what the Psalm says. Take the hurt to God, and ask Him to do what only He can.

When we ask, we may say something like: "Help me out here, God. If I'm going to go through this, don't waste my pain, but help me to learn everything you want me to learn. If I have to experience this, remind me daily that you are right here with me. Maybe you can draw others toward you through this. But God, to be honest, can you step in and fix it? And if for some reason you choose not to, can you give me the strength to bear it?"

**TRUST** (Psalm 77:11-13 "I will remember the deeds of the LORD; yes, I will remember your miracles of long ago. I will consider all your works and meditate on all your mighty deeds. Your ways, God, are holy. What god is as great as our God?")

Finally, after turning to Him, complaining to Him, and asking Him to help, we are at the conclusion of the lament: trusting that He is good, even when things are awful. To declare out loud that you dare to keep hoping in God's goodness, mercy, love, and faithfulness, even in devastating circumstances is an act of trust.

Our Trust may sound like this: "None of this is a surprise for You. You are the God Who designed the body, Who also saves the soul. You are my shield. You have protected me from so much. I have seen You move before, and I know You'll do it again. I will trust You, even when things hurt. I will say, even when things are bad, that You are Good."

Often in America, we are greeted with the question, "How are you?" A culturally-conditioned American will answer, "Good!" I don't think there's something necessarily wrong with that, but fundamentally it makes us try too hard to fake it through hardship. God has given us the language, permission, and example to lament the many things that are not good. We would be wise to utilize this lost discipline.

Are you hurting? Are you bothered by someone else's hurt? On the next page, you will find a lament exercise to express these feelings to God:



## **Learning to Lament Exercise:**

### Turn to God

Example: Psalm 86:1 "Hear me, LORD, and answer me, for I am poor and needy."

Address God as you approach Him in prayer. This could be combined with some elements of "Complaint."

## **Bring Your Complaint**

Example: Psalm 86:14 "Arrogant foes are attacking me, O God; ruthless people are trying to kill me—they have no regard for you."

Identify in blunt language the specific pain or injustice.

## Ask Boldly

Example: Psalm 86:3, 11 "have mercy on me, Lord. Unite my heart to fear Your Name."

Specifically call upon God to act in a manner that fits His character and resolves your complaint.

### **Choose to Trust**

Example: Psalm 86:8, 13, 17 "Among the gods there is none like you, Lord. For great is your love toward me. You, LORD, have helped me and comforted me."

Affirm God's worthiness to be trusted and commit to praising Him.

The Poland Team is gearing up for an excellent week of serving in Gdańsk, Poland. Nine from Hillside will be gone from June 27 to late July 5. Pastor Kevin, Heather and Taryn Fath, Rebecca and Brooke Bowlby, Jen Kline, Scott Mason, and Keith and Pam Vandegrift are looking forward to ministering alongside our missionaries, Nick and Jill Toothman.



Our primary ministry will be unto Ukrainian refugee children as we help the church members of 4th Baptist Church of Gdańsk put on their Bible Camp. This camp will be similar to our VBS, lasting about 4 hours, 4 of the days that we will be there. We will be in charge of a portion of the camp as we have been asked to teach English using Bible stories and lessons and run some English-based stations in where God's Word is used in teaching the Ukraine's, and some Pole's, English. We will also be involved in Humanitarian Aid efforts in where we have been asked to share our salvation testimonies and clearly present the Gospel (all through translators). Some of us will be leading in devotions and participating in some other teaching opportunities. We look forward to sharing how the Lord worked when we return.




